

VCE and VCE VM

Ready to tackle Years 11 and 12 and looking for an alternative to school in 2024?

The VCE Vocational Major (VM) is suited to young people between the ages of 16 and 18 years old at the time of enrolment. It offers an applied learning pathway to achieving the VCE certificate, within a flexible and adult learning environment. Year 11 and 12 students gain a pathway to further study, a degree or employment, giving you choice and flexibility while gaining career-ready skills and qualifications.

Select subjects aligned with your interests, including those from VCE VM, and traditional VCE, while achieving an accredited VET qualification.

Traditional VCE is offered as both a youth program and adult program. The youth program is best suited to students who wish to continue their year 11 and/or 12 at TAFE and who are between 16 and 18 years of age. The Adult VCE is best suited to students returning to study and who are 18 years and older, and will be eligible to complete a year 12 only qualification. Students can choose from a variety of VCE subjects, including an accredited VET qualification.

Once you've completed your VCE or VCE VM, we'll help you gain direct entry into your chosen apprenticeship, traineeship, diploma and/or degree pathway. No ATAR? No worries.
